GIBFF HONORS Presentation - The GIBFF celebrates the legacy of festival founding member, Kelechukwu Brnfre by taking a moment to honor Gary's best by presenting the Kelechukwu Brnfre Vanguard Award.

Followed by the powerful documentary,

Perry Wallace was a mere teenager when he stood all alone at center court in such hotbeds of rabid racism as Starkville, Mississippi and Tuscaloosa, Alabama. It was the turbulent 1960s, and even then, athletes in the entire SEC were restricted by 'whites only' segregation.

Narrated by Academy Award winner Forest Whitaker, TRI-UMPH is not a sports film as much as it is a unique window on America's civil rights movement (with never-before-seen footage of Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., and Stokely Carmichael) that chronicles Perry Wallace's evolution from a reluctant pioneer in the final throes of the Jim Crow era to a determined game-changer, whose actions altered the way of life throughout the South.

Mike Anderson is a senior at the guintessential New-England liberal arts school, Frost College. And Mike is eight weeks away from graduation. On this particular day he has his African-American Literature class with his favorite professor. But today, Mike is feeling sadness. He's feeling isolated. He's feeling Angry.

Taking place in real time, 1 Angry Black Man provides a voyeuristic view of the difficult conversations young people engage in. As they navigate the society in which they live, the students draw from the intellect of master writers such as James Baldwin, Zora Neale Hurston, August Wilson and Ta-Nehisi Coates. Through their old books they find modern solutions, uncover new questions, and push the political boundaries, forcing each other to reckon with the truths they keep hidden in the dark.

Chosen Foe Life Dir. **Montel Williams USA** 2017 33 minutes

Chosen Foe Life tells the story of a young man named Dashawn Miles and his struggle with trying to find comfort in his poverty stricken circumstance, while trying to survive in the violent streets of Chicago. Choosing the right or wrong path is his challenge, a challenge that will either make or break him. The decision is his. What will he choose? Whatever that decision may be, it will ultimately alter his life.

Alana Devich Cyril is on a quest to figure out how to navigate life following a stage 4 cancer diagnosis. In this comical, poignant documentary, she wants to show the world what her life looks like, but things like 3 million doctors appointments and a fear of travel get in her way.

Grrrl Justice Dir. Shontina Vernon USA 2018 16 minutes Grrrl Justice is a short narrative film exploring the pathways of girls and queer youth of color into the juvenile justice system. It uses gender and sexuality as a framework for understanding their rising rates of incarceration. Through the lead characters in this powerful triptych, we also come to understand the power of story and the necessity of art and youth led community spaces in their healing and liberation. Written and directed by Shontina Vernon.

Femme Queen Chronicles - Episode One: The Clock Dir. Ahva Simone USA 2018 11 minutes

Femme Queen Chronicles is a web-series about the lives of four black trans women as they navigate through love, life, trade, and shade in the city of Detroit; written, directed, and brought to life by black trans women themselves. In Episode One, the four friends just try to make it through the day without getting clocked as trans women †or clocking someone else over the head instead.

AJE IJO SERIES (3RD INSTALLMENT): RIVERS OF NINE Dir. Kiana Harris USA 2018 20 mins

AJE IJO Short Dance Film Series centers the humanity, resiliency, vulnerability of black & african diasporic people [of all genders], interrogating the western gender binary and interrupting accompanying notions of masculinity and femininity. Our individual and collective complexity, survival, thriving, and ultimately our healing as a people are at stake, and compel the elaboration of this narrative. To this end, the Ã-Â-Â⊡lm elicits elements of spiritual cosmologies of the african diaspora, particularly those that emerge from the Yoruba divine consciousness, Ifa, and the Orisa (deities) that comprise it.

Totally Becky Dir. Dre Robinson USA 2018 20 mins Becky Mason-Happ is a super revolutionary Black woman who gets in trouble because she has no filter when injustice surfaces. People are apprehensive to hire her and her professional career and family suffer from it. Yet, she knows how to code switch like a mug.

Sincerely, The Black Kids Dir. Miles Iton USA 2018 35

Sincerely, The Black Kids is a documentary on the institutional challenges black student government leaders face in primarily white institutions nationwide.

Across the country, universities everywhere are becoming battlegrounds for racial politics and agendas. For every loud proponent of 'agreeing to disagree' that surfaces, there's a group of black students who don't enjoy the privilege of choosing to be moderate. Follow the stories of black student leaders from American University, Cornell University, Clemson and New College of Florida in Sincerely, the Black Kids, a documentary of triumphs and tribulations that prove sometimes it IS because you're black. blackout

Stirring and suspenseful, VAYA culminates in an explosive moment based on real accounts. Omotoso's collaboration with first time feature cinematographer Kabelo Thathe pairs stunning aerial shots with fast paced images in Johannesburg to intertwine the stories of strangers struggling to survive. Grey Walls Dir. Michael Kunke Ghana 2018 6 mins

Grey Walls is a short narrative video about the complex story of slave trade and the Elmina Castle. The videotry which is a blend of video and poetry relies on powerful narrative to tell the story of the harrowing experience of slaves at the Elmina Castle. Elmina Castle was built by the Portuguese in 1482, it had the distinction of being the first of many permanent slave factories dotted along the coast of West Africa.
